Phillip Berry's story of being on board as the CL66 was moved from San Francisco to Boston in 1957 for it's conversion to the CLG7 is one that is truly worthy of sharing. If it wasn't for Phillip and the others in the skeleton crew aboard in March or April of '57, the conversion from CL-66 to CLG-7 may not have taken place.

Phillip Berry DC3, Eng Div, 57-57 was "volunteered" to be part of the crew that was to be aboard during this move, and what an adventure it was. With no power except for one generator, meals, sleeping quarters, showers and toilets were all makeshift. Phillip says the toilet was mounted over a hole on the fantail, along with a bucket with a line attached to get some water for the flush and the fantail became the poop deck. He an another Shipmate raised an Irish Flag in honor of St Patrick's Day.

It was slow going, as it got towed from San Francisco through the Panama Canal and on up to Boston. Certainly not the best duty station, but we do owe Phillip and those who were on board with him our thanks for getting the ship to the right place so the CL66 could become the CLG7.

Phillip says it was his last assignment as his term of enlistment was up and it was time to move on to other things. At 89 years of age, he now lives in Newtown, CT.

Vice Admiral Jimmy Pappas began his Navy Career as a Seaman Recruit in 1956 and retired as a Vice Admiral in 1991 During his time on active duty, his duty stations included sea, shore and staff duty assignments ranging from Division Officer to Commanding Officer to the Flag Officer in Command of all Atlantic Fleet Replenishment and Repair ships and as the Director of Logistics during Desert Storm for General Colin Powell.

On board the USS Springfield from 62-64 he was both an Operations Officer and Deck Division Officer.

In reading this book, I found myself reliving moments spent on the Springfield as our ship carried out its normal at sea refueling and replenishing maneuvers. I also truly enjoyed reading about Vice Admiral Pappas' assignments as he advanced in rank. Jimmy generously donated a few copies of the book, which are available in the Ship Store. Thank you, Jimmy, for sharing your story."

USS SPRINGFIELD CL66 UPDATE

USS Springfield (CL-66) was one of 27 Cleveland-class light cruisers built for the United States Navy during World War II. She was the third US Navy ship to be named after Springfield, Illinois. Commissioned in 1944, she served briefly in the Atlantic before transferring to the Pacific. There she served with fast carrier task forces, primarily in an anti-aircraft role, but also in a shore bombardment role in the last stages of the Pacific War. She earned two battle stars for wartime service. Like all but one of her sister ships, she was decommissioned and laid up soon after the end of World War II. In 1957, she was towed from San Francisco to Boston to be converted to a Providence-class guided missile cruiser 🦸 👍 and modified to become a flagship. In 1960 she was recommissioned as the CLG-7 Flagship.
