2. YORKTOWN REGULATIONS: While the ship is alongside the ammunition piers, the following rules will apply:

- a. No smoking in any vehicle.
- b. No smoking aboard ship except in designated spaces and then only when the word is so passed.
- c. No lighters, matches, etc. will be allowed off the ship.
- d. No smoking on pier except in the smoking shack.
- e. No boiler tubes will be blown.
- f. Incinerator will not be used.
- g. No welding aboard ship.

3. AMMUNITION HANDLING PRECAUTIONS: Most casualties occurring during ammunition handling evolutions have occurred because someone was careless or did not know the proper procedures. While carrying projectiles they shall be cradled in your arms like a baby, paying particular attention to base and nose fuzes, if installed, to prevent them from being struck. Never drop a projectile! Lay it down gently either on its base or side. Remember, explosive projectiles can save your ship and shipmates in time of war, but can also destroy you if you do not have respect in the way you handle them.


4. PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS: Division Officers are reminded to insure compliance with provisions contained in SPRINGFIELD Instruction 1616.2D regarding discussion of Enlisted Performance Evaluations with the individual concerned. All Division Officers not holding a copy of this Instruction may obtain one from the Ship's Secretary.

5. ANSWER TO YESTERDAY'S QUESTION: The ship was the RANGER commanded by John Paul JONES. Captain JONES set many of the standards of leadership, courage, and perseverance that are traditional in our Navy.
