ORDERS OF THE DAY

1. DUCTING. All Division Officers will inspect their spaces for cracked, torn or deteriorated ventilation ducting. Defective ducting is to be reported to D.C.N. in the Log Room prior to 1630, 10 May. Negative Reports Required.
2. MESS COOK QUOTA REDUCTION. Effective Monday 13 May, a ratio of 1 mess cook for 20 men will be observed. Detailed instructions will be promulgated to Department Heads by the Supply Officer.
3. 11 May 1963. No leaves, liberties, transfers, shore leaves, etc. will commence on this day until the shift of COMSIXTHFLT Flag to the USS LITTLE ROCK is completed.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. FUZZLE. When is a sargeant both non-rated and in the Navy? ANSWER: When he is a seaman in the OR Division named Sargeant TAYLOR.
2. INDUSTRIOUS SCHOLARS. The study lamp has been burning brightly in SPRINGFIELD of late. Yesterday, 56 Navy Training Course certificates were signed. Eight men: James C. COOK, "M" Division (3.84); Herbert J. ZAUN, "B" Division (3.80); Francisco RAYANDAYAN, S-5 Division (3.81); Peter A. LAINE, S-4 Division (3.94). John T. REDNARZ, "B" Division (3.83); Kenneth B. MC NEIL, "E" Division (3.81). Ronald L. HARDOIN, MAA Force (3.81) and Roger "The Lodger" MYERS of the OR Division (3.84) all attained the superior scores indicated in parenthesis, above "Volume leaders" were FIRST Division and "B" Division with 11 and 10, respectively.
3. DID YOU KNOW. That the following have been accomplished by the Weapons Department since our deployment to SIXTHFLEET as Flagship:
 - (1) Saluting Battery - has fired 2,250 rounds
 - (a) Most rounds fired in one day: 157 (Athens - 11 March 1963)
 - (b) Most rounds fired in one port: 187 (Athens - 11-18 March 1963)
 - (2) 5"/38 Battery - has fired 985 rounds
 - (3) 6"/47 Battery - has fired 489 rounds
 - (4) Missile Battery - has fired 19 Terrier BW-1
 - (5) MK 37 Director has earned 3 consecutive "E"s
 - (6) MK 34 Director has earned 2 consecutive "E"s
 - (7) Turret has current "E"
 - (8) Mount has current "E"
 - (9) Missile battery scored direct hit (skin-to-skin) on KDB-1 drone 25 APR 62 with telemetered BW-1
 - (10) For first time in SIXTH Fleet - 4 missile ships (SPRINGFIELD as OCE) conducted successive firings during one drone flight underway at 16 knots. on board to observe were SECNAV and COMSIXTHFLT (ADM MC DONALD - new CNO nominee)

- (11) For first time in SIXTH Fleet - 5 missile ships (SPRINGFIELD as COE) and 7 conducted drone firings on CERES range on same day. During two drone flights 9 missiles were launched successfully. SPRINGFIELD firing 3 consecutive successful shots - 25 APR 63. All firings conducted underway at 20 knots or more - SPRINGFIELD's last shot being made at 25 knots in a hard turn.
- (12) SPRINGFIELD holds SIXTH Fleet "rig" time record for cruisers (3 min. 56 sec) established 4 JAN 62 while fueling from USS ELOKOMIN (AC-55)

(13) Has conducted the following seamanship evolutions;

- 48 moorings to pier or buoy
- 11 Med moorings
- 83 anchorings
- 19 Man Overboard drills (1 actual recovered by Helo in less than 4 minutes)
- 95 refuelings from a tanker
- 126 highline transfers of material or personnel
- 32 reamings
- 49 replenishments (from AKS or AF)
- 11 underway **fuelings** of another combatant by SPRINGFIELD

(14) Has conducted the following firings:

- 24 air shoots
- 23 surface shoots
- 25 shore bombardment shoots

(15) And, finally, that LCDR ARNOLD has told 7,313 aviation stories of "Life on the Bird Farm."
