VIRGIN ISLANDS: GEOGRAPHY

The Virgin Islands of the United States consists of 40 islands and keys, of which St. Thomas, St. Croix, and St. John are the largest. They lie 40 miles east of Puerto Rico, 1440 miles southeast of New York, and 995 miles southeast of Miami.

St. Croix, the largest of the group, is 74 square miles in area. St. Thomas measures 14 miles in length and two miles in width, and lies northwest of St. Croix.

St. Thomas, population 17,000, is the most populous of the Islands, and features a rugged and mountainous terrain, with elevations up to 1500 feet. The capitol city of the chain, Charlotte Amalie (rhymes with tamale), is located on St. Thomas.

VIRGIN ISLANDS: HISTORY AND GOVERNMENT

Columbus discovered the Virgin Islands on his second New World voyage, and named them in honor of the eleven thousand virgins who lost their lives defending their chastity on the original St. Ursula's Day.

The Islands ran through many changes of ownership during the following three centuries, and were, at one time or another, possessions of Spain, Holland, England, France and Denmark. The United States purchased the Virgin Islands from Denmark in 1917 for \$25 million.

The executive power of the Islands is vested in the Governor, who is appointed by the President. St. Thomas and St. John share a municipal council, which meets in a joint legislative assembly with the municipal council of St. Croix. Laws passed by the assembly are subject to veto by the Governor, and are further subject to review by the President.

Natives of the Virgin Islands are citizens of the United States.

VIRGIN ISLANDS: CLIMATE

The Virgin Islands enjoy one of the most agreeable climates in the world. Average year-round temperature is 78, with a range of 63-91.

VIRGIN ISLANDS: INDUSTRY AND TRADE

The main money-making business in the Virgin Islands is the tourist trade. Visitors from the mainland and elsewhere deposit more than \$5 million here each year.

The Islands also export several locally-produced commodities, such as rum, bay rum, sugar, bay oil, lime juice, and molasses. Native handicrafts include woven straw, hand embroidery, wood carvings, and paintings.

Food for the Virgin Islands, as well as other basic necessities, is largely imported from neighboring Puerto Rico. St. John and St. Thomas have a few beef cattle ranches and some diary farms, however, which help to keep the Islands from being totally dependent upon outside sources.

NÎGHT LIFE

All the leading hotels feature night clubs with dancing and entertainment. Many of the restaurants also provide entertainment, such as Seven Queens and Ransom House. For real Virgin Islands informality and calypso, however, the native dance halls should not be missed. Most of these are located out in the country, and further information should be sought from the locals in town.

MOVIES

American films are on view at local theatres in Charlotte Amalie. Special rates are sometimes available to military personnel.

SHOPPING

The Virgin Islands are the only free ports under American jurisdiction. Therefore it is possible to enjoy the pleasure of so-called "foreign" shopping with the advantage and ease of the American dollar. Although most necessities are relatively high in price, luxury goods are decidedly less expensive than in the States.

Good buys in St. Thomas include perfumes, leather goods, Guatamalan textiles, Spanish lace, siverware, jewelry, and china. Crystal, Swiss watches, and British woolens are also featured at considerable savings.

SHOPPING (Cont'd)

Shops are generally open until 1730. Prices are fixed on most items throughout the island, so it doesn't pay to bargain. Some recommended shops include:

SIGHTSEEING

EMANCIPATION GARDEN--The abolition of slavery was announced here in 1848; all important ceremonies are still held. The Statue of King Christian IX can be seen here.

FORT CHRISTIAN was begun by Eric Smidt, first governor of St. Thomas, in 1666. You will see the ancient dungeons and torture chamber, and the courtyard paved with marble and slate grave stones. The cannon which protected the fort and St. Thomas in ancient times, now decorate the drive to the Charlotte Amalie High School and the Coast Guard Pier.

BERETTA CENTER--The center has become a famous showplace in the Caribbean. All the traditions of colorful buccaneering days have been carefully preserved and restored by the artistic Beretta family. The Beretta's have transformed the 200-year-old warehouse and slave marts into attractive shops. Walks once trod by the pirates Bluebeard and Blackbeard (Edward Teach) are now bordered by colorful hibiscus and sweet-scented jasmin. Within the three-foot-thick walls which once guarded their plundered treasures can be found exotic merchandise from throughout the world.

SIGHTSEEING (Cont'd.)

MARKET SQUARE is best appreciated very early Saturday morning, when French and native farmers are unloading their donkeys and setting-up displays of tropical fruits, vegetables and flowers. On the west of the square is the Methodist Church. The building on the southeast corner, now a grocery, was once an auction clearing house for slaves.

VILLA OLGA beyond 'Frenchtown', was occupied by British officers from 1807 to 1815. It was the second and last time the British seized St. Thomas. Later, the Villa became the Russian Consulate. Before the First World War the Imperial Russian Atlantic Squadron always spent the winter anchored off Villa Olga. In those days the Villa was the scene of the Islands' most brilliant and lavish social events. It is said that the stained glass and carved wood railing inside were brought from Leningrad by the Russians.

BLACKBEARD's TOWER was so named because it was once seized by the famous pirate Edward Teach, known as Blackbeard, to scan the horizons for the merchant ships he plundered. He was finally captured and put to death on orders from the Governor of Virginia in 1718.

BLUEBEARD'S TOWER was erected in 1689 by Eric Smidt. Some of its original eleven cannon still decorate the upper drive. The romatic history of the tower was extablished when an iron-bound chest filled with milkweed and decayed papers was found, along with a rusty sword. The manuscript contained the story of Musa Hassen, known to all men as Bluebeard. It is conjectured that an escaped victim may have carried the story to Perrault in France. The story is less strengthened by the headstones of seven graves ...they are, complete with names, part of the paving of the cocktail terrace.


SUGAR MILL TOWER, located at the entrance of Club Contant, is one of the few remaining towers which has crowned almost every hilltop in the Virgin Islands. These towers, with huge wind-driven wheels, were used to grind the sugar cane which once covered the island. It was built and occupied (about 1855) by the famous Mexican revolutionist Antoio Lopez de Santa Anna. St. Thomas' elderly persons tell tale of gay parties, cock fights and intrigue... in addition to a harem. All this may be true, considering that Santa Anna was fabulously wealthy at the time of his exile. He was broken both physically and financially when he returned to Mexico to die in 1874.

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Taxi fares are 50 cents per person. The fare is posted in each taxi, but it is recommended that persons agree on a price prior to starting the trip.

Cars may be rented for \$11 per day. Driving is on the left.

There is a bus line running to Lindbergh and Brewer's Bây Beaches. Schedules may be obtained from the locals.






